



WHY SET UP MyTLO AND HOW?

MyTLO allows you to choose particular bills you want to follow. You can see their progress from filing, to committee assignments, to hearings to calendars and to a floor vote for passage. You will probably find that many bills are killed at some stage in the process.



The MyTLO section of the Texas Legislature Online website offers personalized viewing of legislative content.

- 🛅 Bill List: A custom list of bills created by:
 - Manually entering the bill number
 - · Adding the bill number from the bill history page or bill or text search results page
 - o Adding all the bills from a bill search result set
 - 🖺 Bill Alert: Receive e-mail notification when bills on this custom list have selected significant actions added. Bills are added by:
 - Manually entering the bill number
 - · Adding the bill number from the bill history page
 - o Adding the bill number from a text or bill search results page
 - Bill Subject: Receive alerts when bills are assigned a specific subject.
 - 🛅 Other alerts: Receive e-mail notification when selected calendars, committee hearing notices, committee minutes are posted, or the house/senate adjourn.
 - Access RSS feeds for legislative content through your favorite newsreader software.
 - · Access legislative content on your wireless mobile device.
 - Save your bill, amendment, and text searches to use later.

Usage of the bill list, alert list, and saved search features requires registration. Service is FREE of charge (privacy policy).

NOTE: Bill alerts are removed prior to the prefiling period for each regular session. Once prefiling begins, bill alerts will remain intact until the next prefiling period.

Alerts

Access your saved bill, text, and amendment searches.

Mobile Device Support

Learn how to access meeting notices, member information, committee information, and bill status on mobile devices.

RSS Feeds

Learn how to view legislative-related feeds through your favorite news aggregator.


About House Witness Registration

House Witness Registration is the quick and simple new way to register for an upcoming House Committee hearing. House Administration has made the witness registration paperless. Now, you can complete the new 5-step registration process when you arrive the Texas Capitol by using one of the touch screen kiosk stations located in the Capitol Extension. You can choose to save your profile information to use for future hearings.

Registration Station Locations

Registration stations are located in the Texas Capitol Extension on levels 1 and 2.





Mobile Device Access

You can also access House Witness Registration on your iPad through the capitol's public wireless network.

- 1. When within network range, tap Settings on your iPad.
- 2. Next, tap the *Wi-Fi* menu. *Public-Capitol* should display in the *Choose a Network* list.
- 3. Tap <u>Public-Capitol</u> to join the network.
- 4. Once connected to the Wi-Fi Public-Capitol, open a web browser on your iPad and click this link: http://hwrs.house.state.tx.us.

NOTE: Access to House Witness Registration through a mobile device is optimized for iPAD running the most recent version of iOS. Earlier iOS versions or other mobile device platforms are not supported.







CHAPTER 106. VOTING ON ELECTION DAY BY PERSON ON SPACE FLIGHT





Sec. 1. SEPARATION OF POWERS OF GOVERNMENT AMONG THREE DEPARTMENTS. The powers of the Government of the State of Texas shall be divided into three distinct departments, each of which shall be confided to a separate body of magistracy, to wit: those which are Legislative to one,† those which are Executive to another, and those which are Judicial to another; and no person, or collection of persons, being of one of these departments, shall exercise any power properly attached to either of the others, except in the instances herein expressly permitted.

(Feb. 15, 1876.)

† The language of this provision is identical to the language of the official legislative measure that originally proposed the provision. A digital image of the original text of the official enrolled measure can be found here.





Before looking up the bill, explore the whole website. There is so much information there. On the right side of the screen, get familiar with the video section. When your bill comes up for a hearing, you can listen into that committee.

- 1. Look up the bill.
 - A. Find out who Authored it
 - B. When it was filed
 - C. Pull up the text of the bill and read it.
- 2. Has the bill been assigned a Committee?
 - A. What date was it assigned in a committee.
 - B. Go back to the Homepage and look under the House or Senate Committees. Find the committee and click on it to see who sits on that committee.
- Call you Representative or Senator and tell them that a bill you are very interested in has been filed and in _____Committee. You would like him/her to co-sponsor the bill and do whatever he/she can to support and advocate for the bill.
- Sign up on TLO to get alerts when the bill's status has changed.
 Also sign up to receive alerts from STAT at www. texasgop.org, then go to #TXlege.
- 5. Keep track of the bills and call your legislators when the bill moves, OR DOESN'T! We need our Priority legislation through the House or Senate Committee by the middle of April to have a chance of getting through Calendars.






